I thought if a TV would take their mind off it for even half and hour, then I was more than happy to do that for them. Hopefully I won't need it much longer. Hopefully, we find the right medication that will work for me for good, but then it will still be there for everyone else.

## \$83,000 for Bone Density Scanner

The goal for the Wingham & District Hospital Foundation at the 2025 CKNX Healthcare Heroes Radiothon was to raise at least \$83,000 towards a new Bone Density Scanner for the Diagnostic Imaging department. Thanks to all those generous donors who sent in their donations and called during the live broadcast, we have successfully achieved that goal.

The 24<sup>th</sup> edition of the Radiothon took place on Saturday, October 18<sup>th</sup> with nine participating hospital foundations. The live broadcast featured stories from local patients, interviews with healthcare professionals sharing the importance of the medical equipment being funded, and fun opportunities to win prizes such as the power hours and challenge contest.





While we appreciate every

gift, there were a few notable ones this year. We're grateful to Germania Mutual Insurance, West Wawanosh Mutual Insurance, Conway Furniture, the Royal Canadian Legion, and all the local Lions Clubs for their support.

A special thank you to the Lucknow & District Kinsmen Club for a donation of \$60,000 in support of the Radiothon and the bone density scanner.

This will be a brand-new service for the Wingham & District Hospital allowing patients to receive scans closer to home. Early detection of osteoporosis means patients can receive treatment to prevent fragility fractures that are common in our aging population.

The overall cost of the bone density scanner is \$150,000. Successfully meeting and exceeding the goal of raising \$83,000 during the Radiothon has made significant strides towards fully funding the new device.
